THE PRESIDENT'S REPORT

I am going to reverse the usual order of reporting and talk about next ski season first and then come back to the 1999-2000 season.

The 2000-2001 ski season will be a critical one for our Club. Financially we are in solid shape. We will enter the 2000-2001 ski season with more money in the bank than we have had at any time in the recent past. On every other front we need to rebuild and rejuvenate. Specifically,

- we need more Junior and Senior athletes
- we need more coaching resources to support our athletes
- we need to expand our network of support people/volunteers
- we need to provide some adult programs for our Club members
- we need to support and help expand our Jack Rabbit program

Like most small sports clubs, every three or four years we have to rejuvenate our Club by bringing in new people. Our Club is in good shape right now but many of our athletes and volunteers will be moving on in the next year or two and we need to "pass the torch" to the next generation.

We are holding a planning session on April 30th. If you have any interest in seeing our Club flourish, please come to this session.

Now back to this past season. What a year. Notwithstanding the fact that the good skiing lasted less than three months, the year was full of highlights. They included:

- another very successful Jack Rabbit season. Congratulations to Mary Ellen Ripley, the big bunny and all of the other volunteers that made this program great;

- we hosted one of four Ontario Cup events gthe weekend of December 18th and 19th and the Lake Superior Ski Division Championships at which the club award was won by Lappe.

- our Junior and Senior athletes performed well at major events across the country; including events in Quebec City, Hardwood Hills; North Bay; Sault Ste. Marie; and Canmore. - we hosted the best ever Canadian Junior Championships (that's not just me bragging, we received that feedback from dozens of athletes and coaches). The Organizing Committee and the Club as a whole did a wonderful job of organizing the event and it ran without a hitch, despite incredibly warm temperatures and rapidly disappearing snow. The huge amount of planning that went into this event ensured that it went off without a hitch. Every athlete, coach, volunteer, and spectator that I talked to had a blast. I am quite certain that when we next bid for a National event, Cross Country Canada will be pleased to consider us as a host site.

The (almost) Canadian Senior Championships

As everyone now knows, the weather made it impossible for us to run the Canadian Seniors. This was heartbreaking not only for the local and NTDC athletes who were looking forward to competing at their home site, but also for the 100's of volunteers who had been geared up to run the event. We looked at every alternative that would keep the event here. None were viable. The minute we knew we could not run the event here, we concentrated all of our energies on making sure that the new host site (Canmore) received as much benefit as possible from all the organization and planning we had put in. They used our website, our medals, our prizes, and most importantly, two of our critical volunteers, Reijo Puiras and John Guthrie.

However, while the snow was on the trails, so were our Jackrabbits. Another busy season with Children's Races sponsored by Lappe, Lake Superior Ski Division, and Kamview. As a special surprise, this year our Jackrabbits who raced during the LSSD championships succeeded in bringing home to Lappe the Jackrabbit Participation Trophy. This trophy is awarded to the Jackrabbit Club who has the highest percentage of Children participating over the two-day event. This is a first in my three years as Big Bunny. Great work, each and every one!

We also managed to clock in over 3,600 kilometres during Jackrabbit sessions, and give a new meaning to "play on the snow" while we were thrilled with the new trails and hills at Lappe, "Humpty Dumpty" and "The Big S Turn" in particular. We have pictures of leader Marko Seppanen catching air on "Humpty Dumpty". Another surprise for me was skiing up to a couple Green-level skiers who had just enjoyed a ride down Massaro's. We love our hills almost as much as the pancakes upstairs. Thanks to Reijo's mom and dad for another tasty season in the pancake department!

We had some new Jackrabbit families join the Lappe community, and some enthusiastic additions to our leader core. The presentation of skill accomplishment on a colour chart which recognizes accomplishment of new skills when the leader sees the Jackrabbit demonstrate it consistently is a big hit with leaders and Jackrabbits. Thanks Andre for the great idea and work in creating the chart. We are looking forward to using the idea again next year.

Speaking of next year, the Big Bunny ears have been passed on to Judi Vinni who is very excited to coordinate the program next season. The plan is to have an assistant each year who then becomes the Big Bunny, and keeps the volunteer spirit active. Judi did a spectacular job of organizing Cafe Jack-rabbit during the Junior Nationals and earned the Jackrabbit Program \$1,300. The money (along with Bingo contributions) has allowed the purchase of 8 new sets of skating skis and poles.

Special thanks to Jackrabbit parents who make that supreme effort to have their children involved in this great sport...cross country skiing! See you in the fall.

Canadian Master's Championships

Lappe Nordic was well represented at the 2000 Canadian Masters' Championships March 7 – 11.

Brian Berry and Paul Inkila made the drive to North Bay with the Big Thunder masters' convoy. The long drive went by quickly as CRC Communications provided 2-way radios for all vehicles. Thanks to Reid Carter for this great idea. Snow cover on the sides of the Northern Route was thin throughout except for a hundred or so kilometers around Timmins. This raised the hopes of the entire contingent for some good skiing.

The first event was a 10K Classical race in North Bay on Tuesday. North Bay Nordic had been under the same weather influence as Thunder Bay. Snow cover on the trails was thin, with a mix of ice, slush, and wet snow. Nevertheless, the volunteers managed to shovel enough of the trails to hold the event (Brian, the shovel master himself, pitched in for several hours). Temperatures at race time rose to +10C resulting in much klister related panic at the start.

After this race, it was obvious that the thin snow cover, warm temperatures, and predicted rain would make it impossible to hold further events in North Bay. The remaining events were moved 100K north to the Temiskaming Nordic Ski Club.

A 10K Free technique race was held Thursday in Temiskaming. Conditions were mid-winter with the race held in a wind-driven snow storm. The race course selected was a glider's course, resulting in some upsets and near upsets. If you get the chance ask Brian Berry how he almost got a "beaner" after this race.

The third and final race was held Saturday over a more difficult Temiskaming course. Skiers were given the option of competing in a Classical or Free Technique 30K event. Lappe's Ron Mahler made it to Temiskaming for his first Canadian Masters race, and joined Brian in the Free Technique event. Paul skied the 30K Classical.

The three participating skiers continued Lappe's tradition of doing well at this event: Paul – 3 gold, Brian – 2 silver, Ron – 1 bronze. It was a pleasure to compete with an enthusiastic contingent from Quebec. The comradery among these very proud skiers is something special. They will no doubt continue to provide fierce competition at the 2001 Canadian Masters Championships in Charlo, New Brunswick.

Ontario Championships

The Ontario Championships were held March 11-12 in conjunction with the Canadian Masters in Temiskaming,. Ten Lappe athletes competed in the event, with most travelling on the Big Thunder – Kamview - Lappe bus.

Fundraising is an important function in any organization. The Lappe Nordic Ski Club operates one regular evening bingo per month at the two locations of Thunder Bay Community Bingo (Red River Rd and CLE Auditorium). These bingos are the main source of fundraising for the Club and we raise between **\$12,000 and \$16,000** per year. That is a lot of bake sales. With this money, we are able to fund our junior athletes' travel to various competitions throughout Canada. This year we were able to contribute to the Jackrabbit equipment. With the support of this money, we are also able to fund other areas of the ski program at Lappe. Currently we are experiencing a shortage of bingo volunteers with about 20 people working almost every bingo and some working every one. This is a plea for more help. If each club member or Jackrabbit parent could volunteer just once a year, it would be greatly appreciated. Each bingo requires about 4 hours per month from 5:45pm to 10:00pm on the evening of the bingo (sometimes people even get to go home early). Lappe's bingo dates are **April 9, May 23, and June 25**, all at the Red River Road location.
